B ehind every great deal are some great lawyers. Thankfully, the wind industry benefits from many of each.

WELCOME

Thriving in the wind industry is far from straightforward. This was true before the Covid-19 pandemic, as companies sought to expand in the face of increased competition that squeezed profits. That led to M&A transactions, new deal structures and restructurings throughout the sector.

And the situation is even tougher now. Yes, wind has so far been resilient despite the Covid-led financial crisis. But the market is facing huge change. Companies and those who advise them will need to adapt fast for a world that is set to look very different in 18 months.

That's why this is a good time to look again at the top lawyers in wind. These are the people who have helped companies to negotiate the challenges they have faced so far. And they all need to be on top form as the global crisis ramps up. We all know that the oil and gas industries have suffered punishing losses in the first half of 2020. The wind industry will be able to take advantage of this, but only if companies can get deals and developments done. Lawyers will be key to progressing these in a tough economy.

This report celebrates the very best.

We first took on this task in our debut Legal Power List in the headier days of 2016. Since then, the composition of the top 100 has changed. Our goal hasn't. We recognise the 100 lawyers that we believe are the most influential in the global wind industry. These are the people who keep things moving but whose contribution usually gains little attention.

We started the initiative because we felt we couldn't cover lawyers fairly in our other top 100 reports, which are now the European Power List and North American Power List. We felt the legal world needed its own special report, which is why you won't find lawyers in the EPL or NAPL. The fact we can easily celebrate 100 here shows this is the right decision. You can read a summary of how we put together this top 100 and the rankings on page 12; and the full Legal Power List 2020 begins on page 13.

On top of that, you can delve into more detail about the trends that shaped this top 100 on page 4. These include the emergence of offshore wind in Asia, which has contributed to an increase in major project finance lawyers in the Asia-Pacific region as compared to our last such report. This also provided big deals for experts who cut their teeth in Europe.

The number of utility-scale onshore wind projects in the Nordics has been important to this list as this has helped to open the way for new power purchase agreement structures.

And we have seen a steady stream of complex corporate M&A deals.

These varied deal types need a range of lawyers to deal with the complexities they raise. The wind industry has them – as this report shows. Happy reading. ■

WHAT DOES THIS YEAR'S LEGAL POWER LIST TELL US ABOUT THE MARKET?





The composition of the top 100 legal professionals in our 2020 Legal Power List tells us about some of the key trends and issues in wind as we enter the 2020s.

Richard Heap looks at six of the biggest trends that have shaped this list.

Complex takeovers keep in-house lawyers busy

Utilities, manufacturers and developers have been facing squeezed profit margins in the last three years as more nations have launched competitive auctions. This has forced large firms to undertake complex takeovers – and has shaped the upper reaches of this top 100.

Major transactions have included RWE and E.On's €43bn asset swap; Canadian Pension Plan Investment Board's \$6.1bn takeover of Pattern Energy; Mitsubishi and Chubu's purchase of Eneco for €4.1bn; and Siemens Gamesa's €200m purchase of assets from Senvion.

Each transaction is an attempt to grow reach or market share, and each comes with its own complexities. In this report we have sought to recognise the key people behind these deals – both in-house general counsels and M&A experts from private practice.

In total, 12 of the professionals in this list are in-house general counsels or legal heads, and 88 are in private practice. This is a change from the 23:77 split in our last Legal Power List in 2018, because we have focused on in-house professionals that have led companies through these kinds of deals, and those with a larger public profile within their management team.



2 Global reach boosts Magic Circle firms

The top 100 includes professionals from 52 law firms. Fifteen saw two or more lawyers secure places, and the best-represented were Clifford Chance and Linklaters (six each).


In our research, we have sought to ensure that Magic Circle firms don't dominate. But we cannot ignore the global spread of those top companies and their ability to attract skilled practitioners.

Clifford Chance's six are based in five countries, while the six from Linklaters


are based in four countries. This shows their depth of renewables experience worldwide.

The three other Magic Circle firms – Allen & Overy, Freshfields Bruckhaus Deringer, and Slaughter & May – all feature in our top 100 as well.

Overall, our list includes professionals based in 16 countries, with the most from the US (31), UK (25) and Germany (13). Continental Europe is the best-represented region (37).

War for talent rages in the US

Outside the Magic Circle, the largest single law firm on this top 100 is Norton Rose Fulbright with five entrants. Interestingly, two of their US lawyers here (Becky Diffen and David Burton) both featured in our last Legal Power List in 2018 working at different companies.

This highlights an interesting trend we have seen in the US market.

Of the 28 US private practitioners in this top 100, nine have joined their firm in the last two years. This shows there is a war for top legal talent as the energy transition gains pace in the US. Law firms are readying themselves for a world where wind and solar play bigger roles in the overall energy mix. This will only accelerate following a Covid-inspired fossil fuel slump.

Emerging offshore markets boost Asia and UK

The size and complexity of offshore wind projects mean that lawyers who specialise in the structuring and financing of these projects continue to feature strongly.

One quarter of the lawyers (25) in this league table are from the UK, which we attribute to two factors: first, the UK's status as the world's leading offshore wind market by installed capacity; and second, London's status as a global legal centre. Large offshore transactions were a key factor in the rankings for 14 of the 24 UK private practice lawyers in this table. The growth of offshore wind in Asia has shaped this table too. This list includes six lawyers from Asia-Pacific that have worked on taking offshore wind projects through development and to financial close, mainly in Taiwan and Japan.

Finally, two lawyers were included mainly on the basis of their work in opening up the US offshore market. New legal stars will emerge as offshore wind takes off in new markets.

5 The strategic significance of the Nordics

With 1.6GW installed, Sweden came second only to Spain (2.3GW) in terms of onshore wind capacity completed in Europe in 2019. Norway came fifth on the list with 780MW installed.

This shows how important the Nordics are to Europe. This is one of the few parts of Europe where developers can build utility-scale onshore wind projects of a size you'd typically see in the US. Add in the use of corporate PPAs and that is a recipe for complex legal work. We see this influence in this year's list. Six of our top 100 are private practice lawyers based in Denmark, Norway and Sweden; and a seventh, Mogens Thorninger, only made the shift to Copenhagen Infrastructure Partners earlier this year. In addition, seven more from outside the region have been vital in taking wind projects in the Nordics to financial close. The region remains a source of complex legal work.

But, with super-low power prices and more power resistance to wind, this may not last.



6 Should I stay or should I go? It's 50:50

The breakdown of the top 100 shows that the legal profession is as exciting and fast-moving as any part of the renewables industry. In total, 46 of those on this top 100 have never been on one of our Legal Power Lists, and four more have re-entered after missing out in 2018.

This top 100 also features 24 women. That is a rise from the 20 in the previous Legal Power List in 2018, and the track records of the female professionals we saw in our research shows there could have easily been more than those 24. In the end, we had to judge primarily on quality, quantity and complexity of deals, rather than the gender of the people leading the team.

We can't claim the legal profession is somehow equal. The numbers speak for themselves: 76 men and 24 women in this list. But it does appear to be going in a more equal direction.

After that we drew up a shortlist of 250 of the industry's most influential lawyers, and then carried out further research – both independently and drawing on the expertise from their teams – to ensure we used the most up-to-date information. We made our final decisions based on factors

including deal activity, sizes and industry reputation.

This enabled us to narrow down our final 100, which we then ranked using our views on those criteria above. Our decisions are final and can only be based on information available to us. We won't enter into disputes about the composition of the list, but are happy to receive information about lawyers you think we should consider next time. ■

Bartl became general secretary and general counsel of Siemens Gamesa in 2017. Before this, he was general counsel to the wind power and renewables division at Siemens.

There has been no shortage of complex legal work to get stuck into in the last 12 months.

In January, Siemens Gamesa completed the €200m acquisition of three units from insolvent rival Senvion. This included a 9GW fleet of serviced wind farms in 13 European countries.

The company has also been carrying out its own restructuring in response to slimmer profit margins across the sector in the last few years. And, in February, Siemens confirmed it was set to buy Iberdrola's 8.1% stake in the business for €1.1bn. Never a dull moment.

The future looks busy too. Siemens is due to transfer its 59% stake in Siemens Gamesa to Siemens Gas & Power, which is to be spun out as a standalone company and listed later this year. With a deep Covid-led recession in prospect, we believe Bartl will need to draw on all of his 15 years' experience in advising energy and power businesses.


